Curriculum

Primary Years Programme (IB PYP)

Ages: 4 - 12 years old (K - G5)

The PYP is an **Inquiry-based** framework and recognises the importance of the academic, social, emotional, cultural, and physical development of children. The framework contains **5 essential elements**: key concepts, approaches to learning, agency, knowledge, and action. The IBPYP is transdisciplinary, and students learn across six themes that are applied across subject areas. In the final year, the students are involved in a culminating and collaborative experience called the **PYP Exhibition**.

Middle Years Programme (IB MYP)

Ages: 11 - 16 years old (G6 - G10)

In MYP, students study **8 subjects**: Language Acquisition, Language and Literature, Individuals and Societies, Sciences, Mathematics, Arts, Physical and Health Education, and Design. They also participate in **Service as Action** throughout the five-year programme. In Grade 10, students complete a **Personal Project** and have the opportunity to sit the external IBMYP eAssessment on-screen examinations.

Diploma Programme (IB DP)

Ages: 16 - 19 years old (G11 - G12)

This comprehensive, rigorous two-year curriculum culminates in a series of external examinations. Diploma students complete **6 subjects**, three at higher level (HL) and three at standard level (SL). Students also study **Theory of Knowledge (TOK)**, submit an **Extended Essay (EE)**, and participate in **Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS)** initiatives.

School Year

Does the school accept Student's Pass (STP) holders?

Yes, as an EduTrust certified school, ISS accepts Student's Pass (STP) holders. However, approval is at the discretion of the Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA) Singapore.

Following a successful application and confirmation of the offer from us, we will initiate the STP registration process. A Registration Acknowledgement Letter from ICA will then be provided to the family and/or applicant to proceed with the formal online application with ICA directly.

EAL Support

EAL (English as an Additional Language) support is provided across Primary School and High School.

Rolling Enrolment

We accept applications throughout the year and practise rolling enrolment to accommodate families who may be relocating to Singapore at various times of the year. Places are subject to availability and all application requirements.
