
1 Innovative Personalised ISS High School Diploma Pathway

Curriculum

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HSD & Traditional Schooling

A Comparison

HSD Programme

Emphasises diverse assessment methods such as projects, portfolios, and real-world applications, promoting deeper understanding and critical thinking.

Nurtures holistic development by integrating academics with real-world experiences, ethics, and community engagement.

Prioritises competency-based learning, ensuring students achieve mastery in skills and knowledge before moving forward.

Equips students with practical skills, critical thinking, and problem-solving abilities, preparing them for university and career success.

Encourages innovative teaching methods, integrating technology and experiential learning to enhance engagement and understanding.

Traditional School

Primarily relies on standardised tests and exams, which may not fully capture students' practical skills and abilities.

Assessment Practices

Holistic Approach

Primarily focuses on academic subjects, often overlooking character development and practical life skills.

Skill Mastery

Relies on fixed timelines for syllabus completion, which might not allow sufficient time for mastery.

Career Preparation

Focuses on rote memorisation and test-taking skills, which may not translate effectively to real-world scenarios.

Innovative Learning

Primarily employs traditional teaching methods, which might not resonate with all students' learning preferences.

6 Frequently Asked Questions (FAQS)

School Year

Semester 1 – August to December
Semester 2 – January to June

School Hours

From 8:00am to 2:45pm for all grade levels.

Average Class Size

15 – 20 students



Nationalities of the students in school

A mixture of Japanese, Chinese, Korean, UK, US, Australian, Indian, Thai, Singaporeans, Russian, etc.

Are interviews for prospective students required?

As and when necessary.

Does the school accept Student's Pass (STP) holders?

Yes, as an EduTrust certified school, ISS accepts Student's Pass (STP) holders. However, approval is at the discretion of the Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA) Singapore.

Following a successful application and confirmation of the offer from us, we will initiate the STP registration process. A Registration Acknowledgement Letter from ICA will then be provided to the family and/or applicant to proceed with the formal online application with ICA directly.

EAL Support

EAL (English as an Additional Language) support is provided across Primary School and High School.

Rolling Enrolment

We accept applications throughout the year and practise rolling enrolment to accommodate families who may be relocating to Singapore at various times of the year. Places are subject to availability and all application requirements.

Technology Requirement

Students from Grade 6 to Grade 12 are required to have their own MacBook. Software installation will be done at school.
